Livability Academy Fall '22 Cohorts

HACE's Livability Academy launched once again this past Fall, composed of two cohorts working in parallel, one in person and one virtually, for eight weeks. Regardless of the changes in modality, the Livability Academy maintained the same goals of enhancing leadership skills among resident participants and supporting them to develop strategic solutions to neighborhood concerns. Throughout the program, three projects emerged focusing on addressing different quality of life issues (continued to the right):



Fairhill United for Livability envisions a community where neighbors are united together to make a difference by activating public spaces through historical educational workshops, creative community cleanups, and celebrations piloted in Fairhill Square Park.

The *Teen Trauma Team* hopes to create a community that does not have a stigma attached to addressing trauma or receiving help for mental health and proposes to create safe spaces for themselves and their peers to discuss and begin recovering from trauma.

The Literally Literacy Team aims to ensure that all adults have the tools they need to overcome illiteracy. Their project is tailored to empowering and educating adults inbreaking down the barriers to literacy through reading classes, pop-up libraries, and jingles.

The project groups will continue to be supported by HACE to implement their projects and would appreciate support from partners to complement our work! If you would like to create a project of your own, we encourage you to apply for the next cohort of the Livability Academy which will begin April, 2nd 2022. Rebuild Rivera Recreation & Mann Older Adult Centers



Unlike traditional civic meetings, the Restore*Reimagine*Rebuild Rivera & Mann Centers project utilizes the Story Circle process, led by neighbors for neighbors, inviting attendees to share personal stories about meaningful experiences they have had at the Centers or in the neighborhood. As an anti-oppression facilitation method, Story Circles encourage participants to reimagine systems and possibilities for a more connected, supported neighborhood, and aims to create a shared sense of belonging of the public Centers that is vital for inclusive community growth and well-being.

Identified from the wisdom shared during Story Circles were 10 collective values that uphold the Rivera and Mann Centers, over 25 activities that contribute to fostering an inclusive community, and nearly 20 target audiences that could benefit from more comprehensive programming in public Centers. To implement the next phase, referred to as a "Data Jam," a board game was created, inviting residents to move game pieces to indicate which activities should take priority to uphold their collective values, share the benefits each activity has, and identify specific audiences who may engage with that activity.

The Data Jam board game is a unique and innovative play-based model for data evaluation that bridges language-barriers and low-literacy, welcoming residents of all backgrounds to review, revise, and validate insights and ideas that will come to form a "blueprint" as the basis of programming at the newly-renovated Centers. A third stage of this project will soon be launched and welcomes the wisdom of all!

My Voice Matters: Youth-Led Advocacy for Community Safety

My Voice Matters is a youth initiative driven by people ages 14-24 who are passionate about improving community safety. Group formation began virtually in early 2021, when young people in the Kensington and Fairhill neighborhoods were invited by the We CAN Collaborative to connect and explore ways that the system of policing could be improved through participation in an artistic, liberatory workshop series facilitated by Creative Praxis. Following several virtual workshops hosted March through May, the group met in person in late May 2021 to review and refine our many ideas and Recommendations, and prepare for a public presentation of our work, held June 15, 2021 at Orinoka Civic House with community members, police officers, and press in attendance. We reconvened with Creative Praxis in August 2021 to explore next steps for furthering awareness and progress toward actualizing our Recommendations. Findings and information about our process were compiled into a 60-page report, which details ways that not only police, but community organizations and other institutions can effect change for greater community safety.

The group is now working on expanding our impact by developing strategies for distributing the report; engaging other youth by going to different events, protests, and rallies; and welcoming new members. This past Fall and Winter, we have continued sharing our findings with Philadelphia police officers, learning about overlap in changes to departmental policies, and continuing to work towards increased community safety by improving the system of policing and the relationship between the police and the community. We are encouraged to hear that some neighborhood areas with historically tense community-police relations are making progress with building rapport, something we seek to grow into the future. We look forward to building new connections to advance community safety in Philadelphia.



Happy 2022 from Team NAS



Team NAS is a passionate group of 10-17 community members elected by neighbors to represent their neighborhood as they work together to enhance local quality of life through community education, advocacy, events, and initiatives. We provide a platform for civic discourse and help connect neighbors with vital programs and resources.

Since the February 2021 Neighborhood Elections, Team NAS has met consistently, connecting on shared priorities, planning initiatives to address them, and welcoming opportunities for creativity along the way.

Below are a few exciting accomplishments:

- Installation is underway for the Fairhill Slow Zone, bringing \$500,000 of street safety improvements to streets bound by 2nd Street to 5th Street, and Allegheny Avenue to Glenwood Avenue. This follows engagement and advocacy by Team NAS in 2018 and 2019.
- Planning and implementing various arts-based environmental justice projects through the YES Fund in partnership with Mural Arts, leveraging approximately \$12,000 for resident-led efforts.
- Receiving the Kensington Community Resilience Fund grant through Bread & Roses, allocating \$10,000 to support the creation of a cooperative, neighborhood-wide clean and active block initiative through ongoing outreach, providing needed equipment, and cultivating platforms for neighborhood exchange and celebration.

Who can join Team NAS...?

Every two years, HACE convenes an Election Committee tasked with planning, promoting, and facilitating Neighborhood Elections and coordinating the Nominations process. Anyone can nominate candidates; however, Team NAS members must be 18+ years old and live and/or work in the Service Area.
